



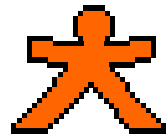

What do we use LML for?

- Hearing and understanding the voice of the learner
- To understand ourselves as learners
- To facilitate the learners' success



What do we mean by learning patterns?

Patterns are behavioural schemas with which one approaches a task

Technical Reasoning

Sequence

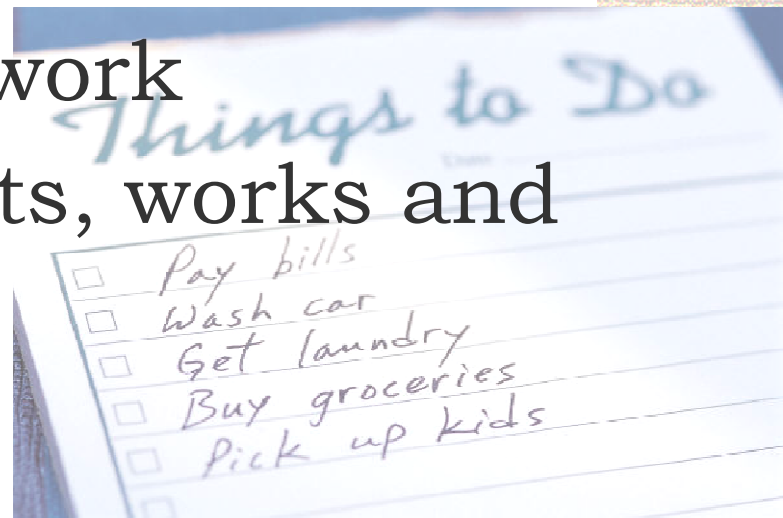

Sequence

Order and consistency

- Clear instructions
- Follow a plan or an example
- I need enough time to complete a task
- Neat presentation of work
- I organise my thoughts, works and projects



Precision

Detail and information

- I need detailed information
- I give detailed information
- I ask a lot of questions
- I like to read and feel comfortable expressing myself with words
- I enjoy knowing that I am correct



Technical

Relevance and Autonomy

- Likes to figure things out and problem-solve
- Needs to know how things work in real life
- I like to show what I know by doing a project
- I like to work on my own
- Avoids reading and writing



Confluence

Creativity and Imagination

- Avoids conventional approaches
- Likes to be different- seeks unique ways to complete a learning task
- Uses own ideas – seeks to be imaginative and creative
- Starts before all directions are given
- Takes risks: fails and starts again
